Claire completed all 12 grades in Hoosier and managed to snag the only good-looking boy in town! Claire met her husband Nelson in 7<sup>th</sup> grade and eventually got married after school. Claire and Nelson

were married in 1954 and they brought 5 beautiful children into the world, Cherryl, Joni, Lane, Glenna, and James.

This family of 7 was constantly on the move, Nelson was a Station Agent and moved to various stations that need a Relief Agent. They travelled to 7 different stations before Nelson had enough seniority to get his own station.
